Course aims / overview	This course continues from <i>Academic Presentations 1</i> . In this practical course students will develop skills to help them present their research in English with clarity and confidence. The first part of the course, students will learn about two types of presentations: (1) <i>Defining a Concept</i> ; and (2) <i>Problem-Solution Speech</i> . In class students will analyse and discuss sample presentations and learn useful techniques and language. In the second part, students will make a presentation based an aspect of their research. This will involve applying skills and knowledge that they have learnt in both courses.		
Requirements	This course builds on knowledge and skills learnt in <i>Academic Presentations 1</i> . However, there are no prerequisites for taking this course – i.e. you do NOT need to have taken <i>Academic Presentations 1</i> .
